I'm sitting with my feet up. It's Friday afternoon, and once again, it is quiet in the church. The week has been filled with laughter, songs, conversations, and the smell of freshly baked buns – but now it's quiet. The tiredness is settling in, but so is the joy. The joy of having spent a fantastic week with a wonderful group of children who, over the course of five days, have left their lively mark on both the church space and our hearts.

This year's summer camp theme was Danish Holidays. And how do you fit all of Denmark's rich holiday traditions into just five days? You dive into it with imagination and curiosity.

We began with Fastelavn, eagerly taking turns hitting the barrel. Then came the hope of Easter and blooming decorations, Grundlovsdag with the national anthem, birthday layer cakes, folk dancing, and community spirit, and Sankt Hans with bonfire and a witch on top – and finally, we ended with Christmas, rice pudding, æbleskiver, and dancing around the Christmas tree in the middle of July. It may sound a bit silly – but it was magical.

Because behind the homemade masks, braided Christmas hearts, and twist bread around the fire, something much bigger was hidden: the experience of belonging. The children played, learned, and laughed together. They spoke Danish and felt that they weren't alone in having one foot in Denmark and one in Canada. They saw themselves reflected in one another – and in us adults. And we? We were moved, inspired, and perhaps a little wiser. There is something quite special about spending five intense days together. Small conversations over lunch, laughter during games, small conflicts that get resolved, and those quiet moments when a child comes to sit close by – just to be near. When we say goodbye, it's not to unfamiliar children – it's to young people we've come to care deeply about. And often, when we say goodbye, we can see that they've grown a little – not necessarily in height, but in confidence and experience.

As one of the youngest participants put it when we talked about growing older: "When you grow old, you get different shoes, and then you don't dance as fast." It made us smile. And perhaps it's true – maybe we don't dance as fast. But we still dance. And this week, we danced together – children and adults, young and old – in a shared rhythm of tradition, language, and joy.

Thank you to all who helped make it possible – children, parents, and volunteers alike. We're already looking forward to next year.
