There we stood, in the middle of Mr. Grati's clear August day, tasting the sweet and sour blackberries. And that was okay, because he had given us permission to borrow it all, as much as we wanted. It made me bubble with joy after that discovery.

It was a challenge to coordinate the repairs in the basement due to the recent flooding while still allowing the French children's day camp to make use of the facilities as they needed. With luck, the final repairs - including new cabinets and shelving - should be done by Labour Day. We even managed to squeeze in a successful garage sale in July. We took some Sundays off for the summer long weekends, and the pastor and family had their summer vacation - but we did our best to have services one way or another. Keep in mind we are the only Danish church east of Alberta - so there are no other Danish ministers to call on, which makes it difficult to ensure services by our pastor for every Sunday.

We also managed to get some exterior repairs made. We have repaved the area in front of the church and added two new accessible parking spaces closer to the elevator door. We put new signage on the front wall facing Finch. We repaved the back corner of the church, and part of the parking lot. We have also been upgrading the kitchen in the rectory and giving it a whole new open look. We still have issues with our Wi-Fi and hope to get that fixed as we want to be able to broadcast live-streamed services again. Even though we had the lazy hazy days of summer – they were put to good use here at the church.

In September, we are gearing up for the fall season with all of our weekly/monthly activities getting back to full swing starting with our annual Welcome Back Fest on Sun Sept 8: we have an Art Show on Sat Sept 28; the Thanksgiving Dinner is on Sat Oct 19; and plans for the big Fall/Christmas bazaar on Nov 16 (including pre-orders for imports) are in process. 


THANKSGIVING DINNER READY FOR ANOTHER GREAT EVENING?
