PASTOR'S CORNER

"Do you believe in angels?"

We go to school. Every morning, my daughter and I walk together. Often, we walk with her friends. They know that I am a pastor. "Do you believe in Angels?" a boy asks me one early morning. He looks at me with serious eyes. My curiosity is piqued. First thing that comes to mind is a song that has been playing on repeat in my house lately. It is called "A song about Angels" and the first lines go:

" Do you believe in angels? Do you still think they are here? Or have they long since left us, Vanished one by one?"

"I guess I do," I say. I understand him if he doesn't. I have never exactly met an angel. But when I think they don't exist, I try to embrace myself and my doubt with great gentleness: I try to leave a door slightly ajar to the astonishing and wonderful world where God walks among people.

A few generations ago, it would have been unusual to doubt the existence of angels. Angels were a fixed part of people's religious world view—they were God's messengers, guardians of humanity, and a symbol of hope and protection. They existed in people's daily lives, in stories, in the church, in art, and in culture. Believing in angels wasn't just a conviction, but a natural extension of faith. Today, the world is different. Our relationship with faith and the mystical has changed. We live in a time where many feel torn between rationality and spirituality.

We may have an instinctive urge to dismiss the existence of angels as superstition or symbols without real meaning, yet at the same time, we are drawn to the idea that there is more between heaven and earth. We can simultaneously say we don't believe in angels, yet still be moved by their beauty and presence when they appear in art, in Christmas decorations, or in a child's artistic creation.

On the way to school I think that is also what is at play between me and the boy. We don't excactly know that angels exist, but the boy proudly shows me a beautiful angel he built from scrappy newspapers. I think of the angels my grandmother used to make for me. She wasn't religious, but every year she created beautiful angels—some knitted, some made of lace, others of glass or paper. Always angels. She knew I loved them. Every year, they hang and decorate our Christmas tree. They light up the tree among all the other ornaments. And they remind me that Christmas is the time of year when God still walks among us.

The Lucia Pageant is on Sunday Dec. 8 with Christmas hygge in the Hall afterwards – great fun for all. Christmas Eve is on a Tuesday this year – we will have a 2:00 pm service in both English and Danish.

We will take credit cards in most of the booths, but bringing cash to the event is also a good idea.




