
PASTOR'S CORNER

We draw lines

Not long ago, while scrolling through Instagram, I stumbled upon a captivating post that immediately grabbed my attention. It was an illustration by David Hayward, better known by his Instagram alias, nakedpastor. What caught my eye was how precisely it depicted our human tendency to draw lines and set boundaries. between ourselves and others. We have this innate desire to distinguish between who we consider genuine and those we wish to deny genuineness, often using these boundaries to exclude others.

Yet, there was someone who defied this pattern. He was both man and God. He was a boundary-breaker. In the gospel, we read about how he consistently stood on the side of the marginalized.

Jesus, in the illustration, is portrayed as someone who dismantles barriers between people.
He reached out to lepers, the sick, women, children, and societal



outcasts, embracing them into his community of love and acceptance.

The Danish pastor and poet Johannes Møllehave also wrote about Jesus and lines. He writes this in a hymn:

"He drew a line over every line that is set between you and me. So not one of those the Lord created shall be called outside and entirely lost." (translated by me)

That verse echoes Jesus' mission to erase the lines of division, ensuring that no one created by God would be deemed as outside or lost. His ultimate act of love, depicted by the cross, symbolizes his journey of companionship with all those who were and are excluded.

Jesus disrupts our systematic boundary-drawing by drawing a

line over our lines.

In a world where lines are constantly drawn to separate, Jesus invites us to erase those lines and embrace each other with love and compassion. Let us strive to follow his example, reaching out to those on the margins and building bridges of understanding and acceptance.

And the Lord said: "Let there be a flood......"

Wait just a minute. I think the inference here is all wrong. I have very sincere doubts that the Lord had anything to do with the floods we have recently experienced here at the church.

Just to be clear – on April 3rd I got a call from the church saying that there was "a lot of water in the basement and I should maybe come out and have a look".

Long story short – there was 2-3 inches of water in the basement; it was a problem with the main city sewer line; a call was placed to the city (311) for help; within



two hours of my arrival, the restoration team was pumping water out of the basement as fast as it continued to come in from the drains.

It took the city 22 hours before they fixed "their" problem –then we could start to fix our problem.

Despite our concerns, we were told "don't worry, we'll get it ready for you." They did pull through. And not only after the first flood, but also after the second almost identical flood three weeks later – again since the city did not properly fix the original problem the first time.

There are still boxes here and there and the appearance of an unfinished basement in some areas – but we can have access to what we need, and – with a little bit of patience and flexibility – we can continue with the great work that we do in our church. Actual repairs will also take time but this will happen in stages so that we will always have the use of our church as best as we can get.

There are many things to be thankful for - this restoration team is one of them.
