

History of Sunset Villa

In 1950, a group of Danes initiated plans to establish a retirement home for members of their community. The First Board of Directors was elected on May 13, 1950. Fundraising efforts kicked off with events like dances, lotteries, bazaars, bake sales and donations. The next step was to locate the ideal property in the perfect location. A property in Crieff, previously owned by Lieutenant Colonel John Bayne Maclean (1862-1950) came up for sale. The estate had been used as a summer residence by the well-known publisher of Maclean's Magazine, who inherited it from his father. The property was acquired on June 5, 1955 when the inauguration of Sunset Villa took place. This date was also the first Constitution Day celebration held at Sunset Villa. This event has since become an annual tradition.

Sunset Villa currently includes The Danish Place restaurant, 10 apartments for seniors, a 60 site RV campground, a party dome and 50 acres including a pond and trails. Sunset Villa generously donated 1.03 hectares of land for the establishment of the Mindepark cemetery on December 10, 1990. The cemetery serves as a final resting place for the urns of individuals of Danish descent.
